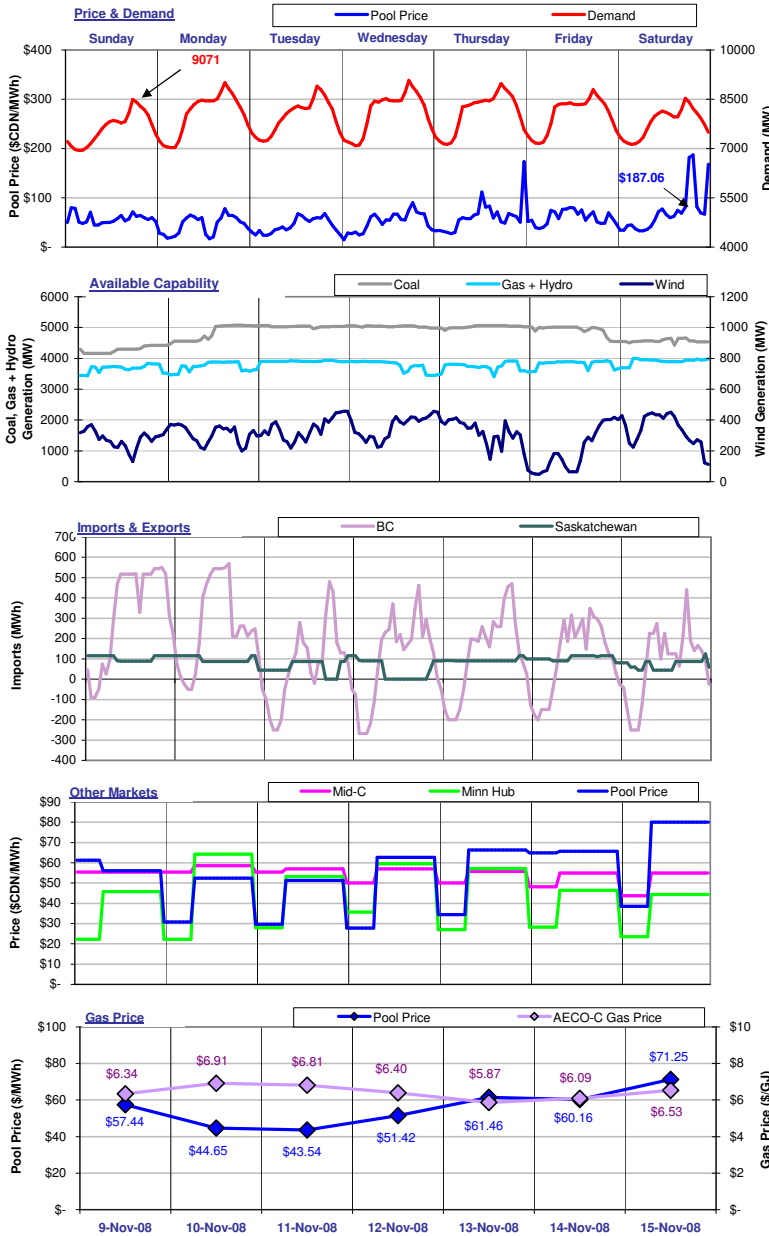

Weekly Highlights



For the week ending November 15, 2008, **Pool Price** averaged \$55.70/MWh and ranged from a minimum of \$14.70/MWh in HE01 on Wednesday to a maximum of \$187.06/MWh in HE20 on Saturday. **Demand** reached a high of 9071 MW in HE18 on Sunday and a low of 6943 MW in HE04 on Monday. Average demand for the week was 7955 MW. **Pool Price** and **Demand** were positively correlated last week with an R-squared value of 0.16.

Coal Unit Availability averaged 3457 MW last week. This is an equivalent availability of 58%. **Gas, Hydro and Other Unit Availability** averaged 3397 MW last week, which is an equivalent of 70%. **Wind Generation** averaged 218 MW last week. This is an equivalent availability of 44%. Availability numbers are based on MW offered into the energy merit order.

Alberta was a net importer from BC last week with total imports equal to 25,333 MWh. Alberta was a net importer from Saskatchewan last week with total imports equal to 13,735 MWh. Overall, Alberta imported 39,068 MWh of electricity last week.

Pool Prices were generally higher than prices in Mid-C and higher than prices in Minn Hub last week. **Mid-C** prices averaged \$56.34/MWh on-peak and \$49.79/MWh off-peak. **Minn Hub** prices averaged \$54.15/MWh on-peak and \$27.33/MWh off-peak.

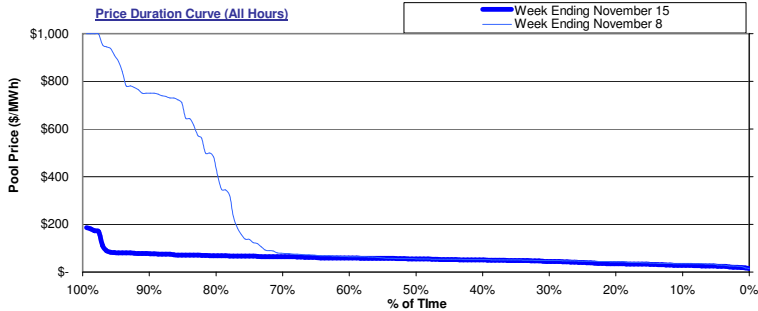

The average **AECO-C Gas Price** last week was \$6.42/GJ and ranged from a minimum of \$5.87/GJ to \$6.91/GJ. Prevailing gas prices resulted in market heat rates ranging from a low of 6.39 GJ/MWh to a high of 10.91 GJ/MWh. The average market heat rate for the week was 8.74 GJ/MWh.

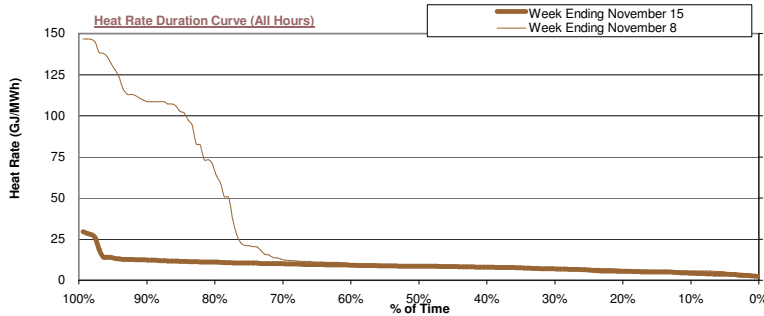

The price duration curves show the % of time that prices were at or below a certain value during the week.

For the week ending **November 15**, prices were at or below:

- \$20/MWh 2% of the time
- \$50/MWh 39% of the time
- \$100/MWh 96% of the time
- \$250/MWh 100% of the time
- \$500/MWh 100% of the time



The heat rate duration curves show the % of time that the implied market heat rate was at or below a certain value during the week. For the week ending **November 15** implied market heat rates were at or below:

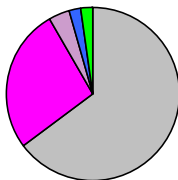
- 5.0 GJ/MWh 14% of the time
- 10.0 GJ/MWh 70% of the time
- 15.0 GJ/MWh 97% of the time
- 20.0 GJ/MWh 98% of the time

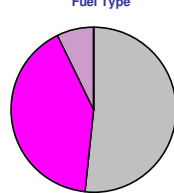

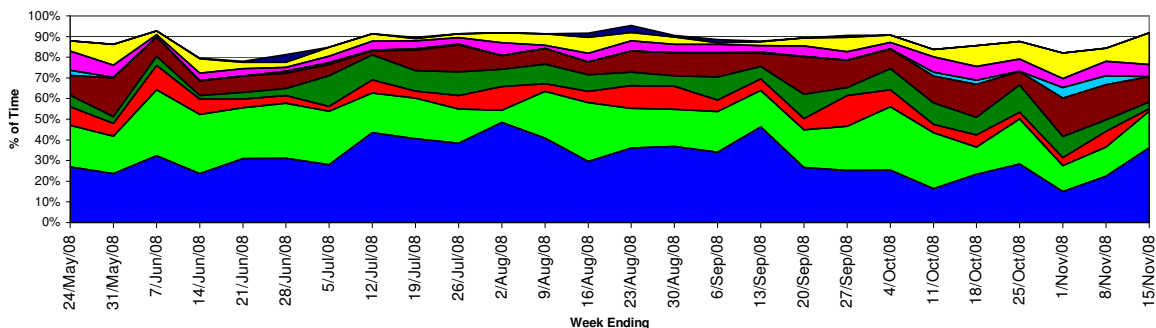

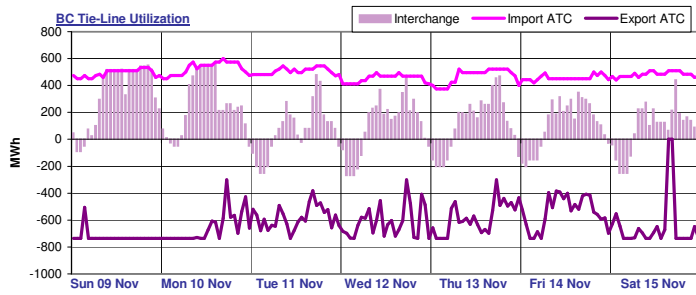
Last week, coal units were responsible for 64.8% of the generation in the province and set price 51.7% of the time. Gas-cogen units accounted for 26.9% of the generation and set price 41.2% of the time last week while other gas units made up 3.8% of generation and set price 7.1% of the time.

A total of 12 market participants set price last week. One market participants set price more than 20% of the time last week. The top price setter set price 36.2% of the time and the top five price setters set price a total of 87.3% of the time.

Weekly Price Setting by Submitting Customer

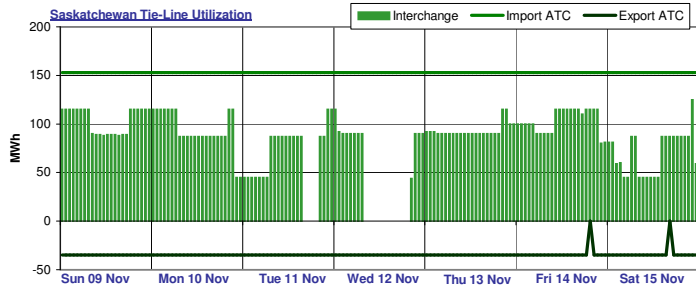


Interties

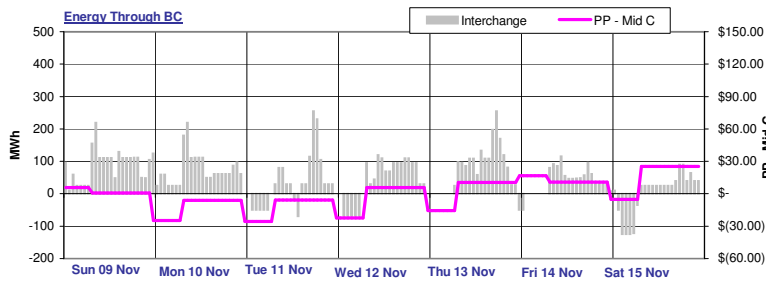


BC import capacity was 38% utilized last week while BC export capacity was 6% utilized. Energy was being imported into Alberta over the BC tie-line 74% of the time and exported out of Alberta over the BC tie-line 26% of the time last week. There was no activity on the BC tie-line 0% of the time last week.

Note: External reserve contract volumes have been subtracted from the BC import ATC as this capacity is not available to import energy into Alberta.



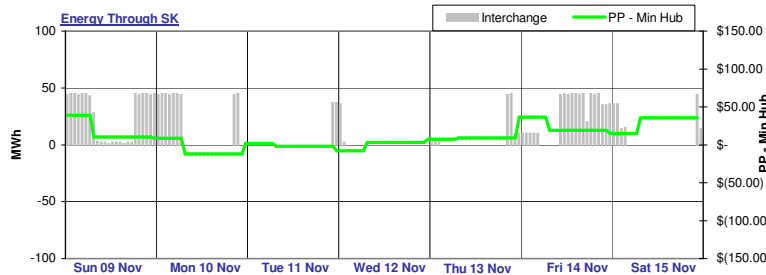
Saskatchewan import capacity was 53% utilized last week while Saskatchewan export capacity was 0% utilized. Energy was being imported into Alberta over the Saskatchewan tie-line 90% of the time and exported out of Alberta over the Saskatchewan tie-line 0% of the time last week. There was no activity on the Saskatchewan tie-line 10% of the time last week.



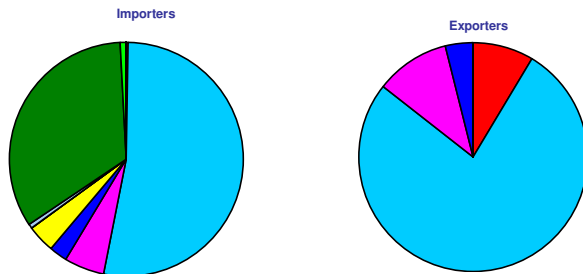
Last week, Alberta spot prices were mostly higher relative to prices in the Pacific Northwest as represented by Mid-C index prices, supporting import activity across the Alberta - BC interconnection.

Alberta prices were generally higher than prices in MAPP as represented by spot prices at the Minnesota Hub, which generally supports import activity across the Alberta - Saskatchewan interconnection.

Note: Platt's day-ahead strip prices used in energy through BC and SK graphs.



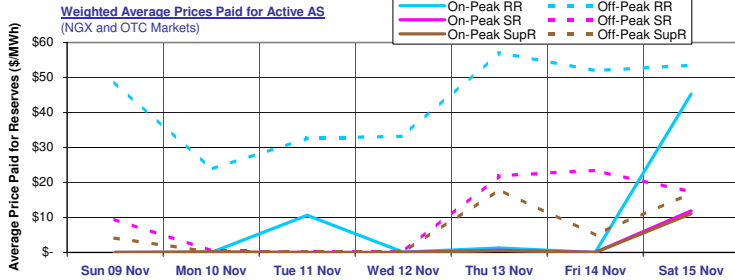
Tie-Line Market Shares



Last week, there were a total of 10 importers. The most active importer had a market share of 52.7% while the second most active importer had a market share of 33.7%. There were a total of 4 exporters last week. The most active exporter had a market share of 77.1% while the next largest exporter had a market share of 10.5%.

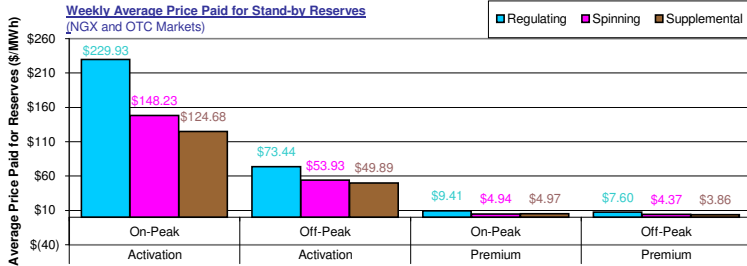
Note: Market shares are based on the combined activity on both interties.

Ancillary Services Market



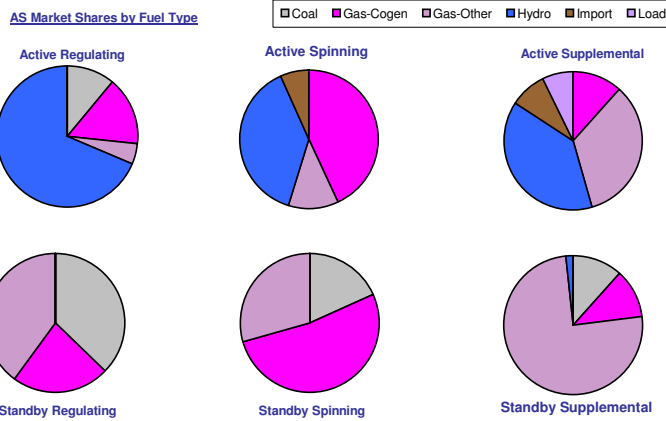
Average on-peak prices paid for active ancillary services last week were **\$8.25/MWh**, **\$1.76/MWh** and **\$1.65/MWh** respectively for active **regulating**, **spinning** and **supplemental** reserves.

Active average off-peak prices were lower and averaged **\$43.92/MWh**, **\$10.56/MWh** and **\$6.37/MWh** for active **regulating**, **spinning** and **supplemental** reserves respectively.



Weekly average activation prices for stand-by reserves ranged from **\$49.89/MWh** for **off-peak supplemental** reserves to **\$229.93/MWh** for **on-peak regulating** reserves.

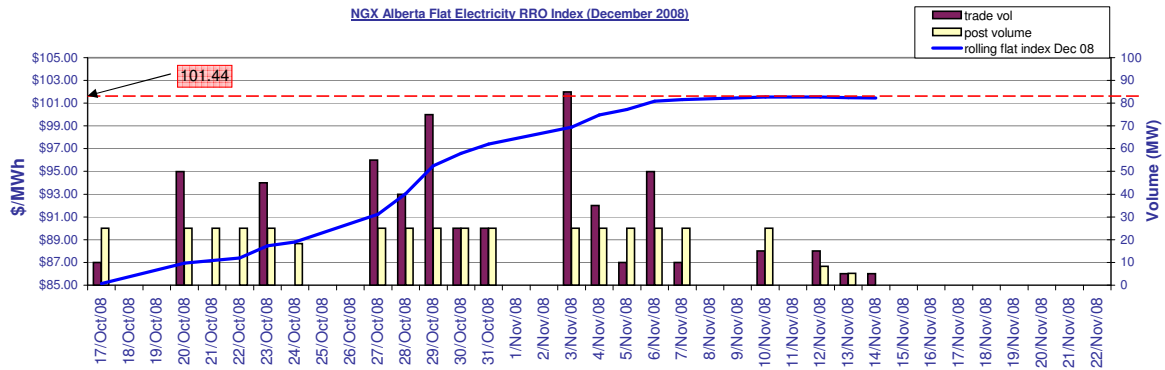
Weekly average premium prices ranged from **\$3.86/MWh** for **off-peak supplemental** reserves up to **\$9.41/MWh** for **on-peak regulating** reserves.



Last week **hydro** units had the largest market share in the **active regulating** reserve market with **68.5%**. In the **active spinning** reserve market, **Gas-Cogen** units had the leading market share with **43%** while in the **active supplemental** reserve market, **hydro** units dominated with a **38.6%** market share.

Gas units dominated the **standby regulating** reserve market with a **39.9%** market share. Leading market share in the **standby spinning** market was held by **Gas-Cogen** units with a **52.4%** market share. In the **standby supplemental** reserve market, **gas** units had the leading market share with **75.3%**.

Glossary

- On-Peak Hours**
In Alberta: HE08 through HE23, Monday through Saturday (prevailing Mountain time)
In Mid-C: HE07 through HE22, Monday through Saturday (prevailing Pacific time)
In Minn Hub: HE08 through HE23, Monday through Sunday (prevailing Central time)
- Off-Peak Hours**
In Alberta: HE01 through HE07 + HE24 (of the same day), Monday through Saturday + HE01 through HE24 Sundays (prevailing Mountain time)
In Mid-C: HE24 (of the previous day) through HE07 (of the day in question), Monday through Saturday + HE01 through HE24 Sundays + holidays (prevailing Pacific time)
In Minn Hub: HE24 (of the previous day) through HE07 (of the day in question), Monday through Sunday (prevailing Central time)
- ATC**
A measure of the maximum energy flow possible in one direction across an intertie.
- Market Heat Rate**
The prevailing Pool price divided by the prevailing gas price.
- Sparks spread**
Sparks spreads give an indication of the revenue available to cover costs after fuel costs have been paid. A positive spread indicates it is more economical to buy gas and generate electricity while a negative spread indicates it is more economical to buy electricity from the grid.
